# Final External Auditor Report and Certificate 2018/19 in respect of Weaverham Parish Council CH0210

#### Respective responsibilities of the body and the auditor

This authority is responsible for ensuring that its financial management is adequate and effective and that it has a sound system of internal control. The authority prepares an Annual Governance and Accountability Return in accordance with Proper Practices which:

- summarises the accounting records for the year ended 31 March 2019; and
- confirms and provides assurance on those matters that are relevant to our duties and responsibilities as external auditors.

Our responsibility is to review Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return in accordance with guidance issued by the National Audit Office (NAO) on behalf of the Comptroller and Auditor General (see note below). Our work does not constitute an audit carried out in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK & Ireland) and does not provide the same level of assurance that such an audit would do.

#### External auditor report 2018/19

On 24 September 2019, we issued a report detailing the results of our limited assurance review of Sections 1 and 2 of this authority's Annual Governance & Accountability Return for the year ended 31 March 2019. We explained that we were unable to certify completion of the review at that time. We are now in a position to certify completion of the review. The external auditor report given in Section 3 of the Annual Governance & Accountability Return requires amendments as follows:

Except for the matters reported below, on the basis of our review of Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR), in our opinion the information in Sections 1 and 2 of the AGAR is in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

- Information in Section 1 of the AGAR is inconsistent with information in the Annual Internal Audit Report. Section
  1, Assertion 5 has been incorrectly completed as information from the Internal Auditor indicates that the smaller
  authority did not review risk assessment within the 2018/19 financial year. The smaller authority must ensure
  that action is taken to address this in a timely manner.
- 2. The AGAR was not accurately completed before submission for review. Please ensure that amendments are corrected in the prior year comparatives when completing next year's AGAR:
- Unpresented cheques are incorrectly omitted from the bank reconciliation and from expenditure in Section 2.
   The figures in Boxes 6, 7 and 8 should read £74,617, £212,307 and £212,307 respectively.
- Section 2 has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices. The Chair has signed Section 2 twice, as
  RFO and as Chair. If the Chair has temporarily been acting as RFO, then another member should sign on behalf of
  the smaller authority. We note that an RFO has now been appointed in line with section 151 of the Local
  Government Act 1972.

Other matters not affecting our opinion which we draw to the attention of the authority:

a. We note that the smaller authority did not comply with Regulation 15 of the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015 as it failed to make proper provision during the year 2019/20 for the exercise of public rights, since correct information was not published on a website as well as a noticeboard. As a result, the smaller authority must answer 'No' to Assertion 4 of the Annual Governance Statement for 2019/20 and ensure that it makes proper provision for the exercise of public rights during 2020/21.
